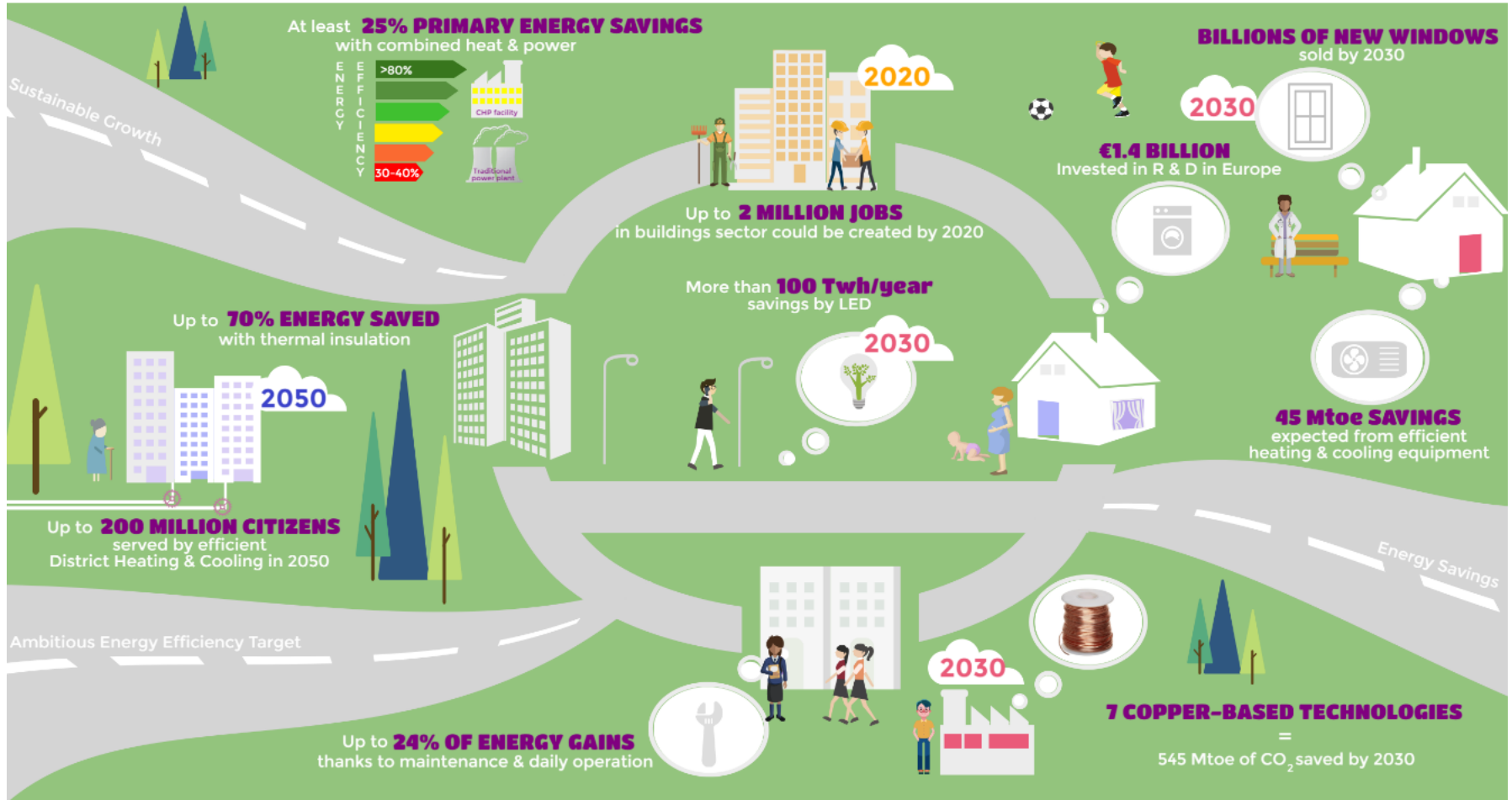

Core values & beliefs:

- European industries design, manufacture and service a vast array of available solutions
- The importance of the EE1 principle

EEIF's input to the roundtable

Key asks:

- EED to stay the cornerstone of EU policy on EE
- Revising the EED to improve the business environment:
 - A longer term perspective (2050) and a predictable regulatory framework
 - Art 7 continue playing a central role (and retaining a certain level of flexibility while not watering down the ambition)
- EED to work in harmony with other pieces of the Clean Energy package, notably EPBD and RES (btw: RES is not EE!)
- In order to achieve true results on the ground: providing « means at the implementation stage and high quality enforcement are of paramount importance
- The EU ETS instrument and EED are . The EED is complementary!
